Dear Mr. Brown:

On June 1, 2000, the Alaska Board of Parole met in full session at the Lemon Creek Correctional Center. Your application for discretionary parole was reviewed at that time and it was the Board's decision to deny you parole for the remainder of your sentence.

In making this decision, the Board considered each of the factors found in AS 33.16.100, with a particular emphasis in your case being concern that the seriousness of your crime would be diminished if discretionary parole was granted. Also, through its actions the Board has assured that you will pose no future risk to the public. The Board has noted that you have accomplished a number of positive rehabilitative goals during your incarceration, and it is the hope of the Board that you will continue your efforts at self-improvement in the institutional setting.

When considering each case, the Board uses as its guidelines Section 33.16.090 and 33.16.100 of the Alaska Statutes and Title 20 of the Alaska Administrative Code. Each case is reviewed individually by the Board and its decisions are based upon the aforementioned factors, with appropriate weight being given the respective factors. The comments made by the Board in your case and presented in the above paragraph are factors which enable its decision to be made. This does not mean that other factors not mentioned were omitted or not considered by the Board, only that the Board felt the aspects noted above were of primary importance when making the decision to not grant parole to you at this time.

You have the right to request reconsideration of this decision within 30 days following the date of this letter. Grounds for reconsideration must be based on one of the four reasons as set forth in the Alaska Administrative Code (22 AAC 20.175). I suggest that you discuss this letter with your institutional parole officer after you have read it. Feel free to contact me if you have any other questions about the Board's decision.
